'Forest Management' submission on Green Paper: Emissions Reduction Fund 'buy-backs'

Thank you for this opportunity to make a late one-page submission, 7 days after 21-Feb-14. We begin with feedback from our event 22-Feb-14, then revert to comments on the ERF Green Paper.

We are responding after our 3<sup>rd</sup> Australian Forests & Climate Action Forum at ANU 22-Feb-14, as agreed. 110 attendees supported the Environment Minister's respect for and acceptance of science, and wanting to *"recognise low-cost, effective abatement opportunities"*.

## 2. General comments on the ERF Green Paper

- Protecting State Forests (public native forests) would provide large volumes of low cost abatement. That could be delivered inside the reverse auction scheme, or outside it through direct re-negotiation of pre-carbon 1990s Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs) with relevant state governments.
- Regional NRM Organisations in these same carbon-dense RFA Regions should evolve into CFI 'Aggregators' servicing private landholders in partnership with land-carbon traders.
